

Notice from FEMA

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) recently authorized you to move into a hotel because you were unable to return to your pre-disaster home.

This notice is to inform you that FEMA has granted you an extended stay in the hotel and that FEMA will no longer continue to pay for your hotel effective Wednesday, November 12, because one of the following applies to you:

- As a result of our inspection, FEMA has determined that you can live in your home

OR

- at the time you registered, you indicated that you had no home damage or your home damage was unknown and we have not heard from you to schedule an inspection

OR

- at the time you registered, you indicated that you had homeowner's insurance and we advised you to contact your insurance company

OR

- you were approved for rental assistance from FEMA on or before October 11, 2008. This assistance should be used to transition to more traditional housing, and you should be using this assistance to pay for your own rental unit. If you have not yet located a rental unit, it can be used to pay for your hotel /motel.

If you remain in the hotel beyond check out time on Wednesday, November 12, 2008, you will be responsible for any further costs.
